

TRAIN TREKS for Kids

Before Your Trip



Contact your destination to reserve your tour and confirm date, if applicable.

Prepare accurate Passenger List of all persons traveling in group. Send one copy with the tour group leader on the trip and take one when purchasing tickets.



Purchase your train tickets at a staffed Amtrak station, at least 7 days prior to your trip.

Review Rules of Conduct with adult chaperones in group, and provide each with a copy.



Take a copy of the letter, your Reservation Checklist, and your Train Treks Passenger List on your trip with you.



Confirmed train reservations are required for the Train Treks for Kids program.

Rules and Tips for a Pleasant Trip

CAPITOL CORRIDOR SCHOOL GROUP PROGRAM

Kid-to-Adult Ratio

One adult chaperone is required for every 6 persons less than 18 years of age.

Keep Watch

Your group must be supervised at all times while on the train or while waiting for the train.

Be On Time

Arrive at all departure locations at least 20 minutes ahead of departure time. Trains and buses will not wait for late arriving groups or individuals!

Let Us Know You're Here

Before boarding the train, identify your group to the conductor, then follow the seating instructions of the conductor and/or other railroad personnel.

Stick Together

Sit together in one area and in one car, where possible. Keep your group together and in their seats as much as possible.

All Clear

Avoid crowding aisles and passageways between cars.

Quiet Please

Personal music devices are not allowed, unless used with earphones or headsets.

Snack Time

Bring your own food and drinks, or take your group to the Club Café car. Only 6 persons from your group 18 years of age and under are permitted in the Club Café car at any one time and MUST be accompanied at all times by at least one adult.

Stash the Trash

Please use the trash receptacles and keep the area around your group clean and free of debris.

We're Here to Help

During your trip, feel free to contact the conductor or other onboard personnel for help.

You're On Your Way

When exiting the train, follow the conductor's instructions. Two persons should follow behind the group and check the seating areas and overhead bins for items that may have been left behind. The Capitol Corridor cannot be responsible for lost or stolen items.
